Managing Safety

Corporate Manslaughter & Safety Management

'Prime responsibility for accident and ill health prevention rests with management'. (Health and Safety Executive - HSG65). The Corporate Manslaughter and Corporate Homicide Act 2007 has far reaching implications for managers as does the existing legislation under the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 & the Management of Health & Safety at Work Regulations 1999.

Interactive Safety Management Training

This course provides managers with an understanding of safety management systems, the main occupational hazards and risk management strategies and the principles of risk assessment and control. The Corporate Manslaughter legislation is also covered, as is the contribution that good safety management makes to profitability.

Corporate Manslaughter (Homicide) 2007

The legislation that was enacted under the above bill on the 6th of April is covered. The Corporate Manslaughter legislation has it's own specific content which outlines the responsibilities, potential penalties for non-compliance and the conditions that will lead to a prosecution.
